/a/ The following types of surveyed and unsurveyed public and ceded Indian lands are included: Areas withdrawn under the Executive Orders of November 26, 1934, and February 5, 1935 (43 CFR 2400.0-3 et seq.); areas embraced in mineral withdrawals and classifications; areas withdrawn for survey; and areas restored to entry within national forests (Act of June 11, 1906, 34 Stat. 233, 16 U.S.C. 506-509), within reclamation projects (Act of June 17, 1902, 32 Stat. 388), and within power site reserves (Act of June 10, 1920, 41 Stat. 1063; 16 U.S.C. 791). These lands are not covered by any non-Federal right or claim other than permits, leases, rights-of-way, and unreported mining claims.

/b/ "Land Utilization Project" lands, purchased by the Federal government under Title III of the Bankhead-Jones Farm Tenant Act and subsequently transferred by various Executive Orders between 1941 and 1958 from jurisdiction of the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the U.S. Department of the Interior, now administered by the Bureau of Land Management. Acreages are within grazing districts unless otherwise noted.

- /d/ Arizona decrease of 1,550 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to 1,245 acres of acquired land received by the BLM; 1,200 acres of exchanged land received by the BLM; 3,925 acres of exchanged land (surface estate only) patented out by the BLM; and 70 acres of land patented out by the BLM under various public land laws.
- /e/ "Other Acres" includes acreage on the Barry Goldwater Air Force Range.
- /f/ Arkansas decrease of 17 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to lands patented out by the BLM under various public land laws.
- /g/ California increase of 332,458 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to 43 acquisitions totaling 331,046 acres of acquired land received by the BLM; 14,990 acres of exchange land received by the BLM; 13,257 acres of exchange land (surface estate only) patented out by the BLM; 443 acres of land patented out by the BLM under various public land laws; and 122 acres of land for which the BLM temporarily relinquished exclusive jurisdiction, but land acreage has now been restored to the BLM's jurisdiction.
- /h/ Colorado increase of 6,301 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to 4,967 acres of acquired land received by the BLM; 6,652 acres of exchange land received by the BLM; 4,130 acres of exchange land (surface estate only) patented out by the BLM; 642 acres of land patented out by the BLM under various public land laws; and 546 acres of land removed from the BLM's jurisdiction due to resurvey.
- /i/ Idaho conducted an audit and review of the acreage data. The "Grand Total" column in the *1999 Public Land Statistics* table should have been 11,849,759 instead of 11,861,600. The decrease of 1,975 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to 158 acres of acquired land received by the BLM; 40 acres of exchange land received by the BLM; 301 acres of exchange land (surface estate only) patented out by the BLM; and 1,872 acres of land patented out by the BLM under various public land laws.
- /j/ Montana decrease of 11,955 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to land acreage received and patented out by the BLM under various public land laws.

- /k/ Nevada decrease of 20,873 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to 2,981 acres of exchange land received by the BLM; 5,598 acres of exchange land acreage (surface estate only) patented out by the BLM; and 18,256 acres of land patented out by the BLM under various public land laws.
- /l/ New Mexico decrease of 2,113 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to 281 acres of acquired land received by the BLM, 3,027 acres of exchange land received by the BLM; 2,863 acres of exchange land (surface estate only) patented out by the BLM; and 2,558 acres of land patented out by the BLM under various public land laws.
- /m/ Oregon "Grand Total" column in the *1999 Public Land Statistics* table should have been 16,221,168 instead of 16,221,167. An increase of 3,839 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to 836 acres of acquired land received by the BLM; 5,813 acres of acquired land patented out by the BLM; 300 acres of exchange land (surface estate only) patented out by the BLM, and 2,511 acres of land patented out by the BLM under various public land laws.
- /n/ Utah decrease of 183 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to 100 acres of acquired land received by the BLM, 1,425 acres of exchange land received by the BLM; 1,055 acres of exchange land patented out by the BLM, and 653 acres of land patented out by BLM under various public land laws.
- /o/ Washington increase of 6,668 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to 6,668 acres of acquired land received by the BLM.
- /p/ Wyoming decrease of 475 acres in the "Grand Total" column from the previous year is due to 4 acres of exchange land received by the BLM and lands patented out by the BLM under various public land laws.
