FOOTNOTES

/a/ The Bureau conducted a re-inventory and condition surveys of many facilities to gather data for the Five-Year Deferred Maintenance Plan.

/b/ The Department of the Interior directed BLM to update its inventory of recreation facilities. The Bureau used data from the inventory update and site condition surveys to prepare the Five-Year Deferred Maintenance Plan.

/c/ Arizona acquired additional administrative sites through land exchanges and added communication sites to the inventory for the first time.

/d/ Arizona picked up approximately 120 boat-in recreation sites on the Colorado River that were turned back from the Arizona State Parks Department.

/e/ Colorado added 79 existing recreation sites to the inventory update.

/f/ Montana listed toilet buildings at recreation sites separately in the inventory update.

/g/ Nevada added 40 previously undeveloped recreation sites to the inventory update.

/h/ Nevada abandoned 1516 miles of low-use roads.
