


Publications

- P1 **Crumb Rubber Modified (CRM) Asphalt** (Factsheet): Provides information on how used tires are being recycled for use in "nontraditional" asphalt applications and the advantages and disadvantages of using the CRM asphalt (2 pp).
- P2 **Discovering Dinosaurs** (Educator's Guide): Provides background material and activities to accompany a videotaped satellite broadcast about the excavation of hadrosaur bones in the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument in Utah (62 pp).
- P3 **GeoMAC** (Brochure): Informs the public and wildland fire managers of the real-time Internet mapping system that allows them to pinpoint the location and size of existing wildfires using geospatial technologies (3-1/2" x 8-1/2").
- P4 **Helium Resources of the United States—2001** (Technical Note 408): Provides information on the Nation's identified helium resources, including measurements, locations, uses, production, extraction, and supply and demand forecasts (40 pp).
- P5 **Indian Tribal and Individual Mineral Owners Quick Reference** (Brochure): Explains specific services provided by the five Department of the Interior agencies responsible for trust management and protection of Indian mineral interests, provides contact information, and includes information on the new Office of Historical Trust Accounting (7" x 8-1/2").
- P6 **Integrating GIS Technologies with the Visual Report Management Inventory Process** (Technical Note 407): Provides information to assist BLM field offices in using current GIS and image processing technologies to facilitate new, or improve on existing, visual resource management inventories (36 pp).
- P7 **Making a Difference—BLM's 2000 Volunteer Annual Report** (Booklet): Highlights the contributions of volunteers; describes volunteer activities in support of specific BLM programs; and provides data on the number of volunteers, hours contributed, and value of those contributions (32 pp).

- P8 **Our Vanishing Past: The Crisis of Cultural and Paleontological Resources on BLM Lands** (Report): Provides a state-by-state account of the cultural and paleontological resources on BLM public lands and the risks to these resources, presents what BLM is doing to preserve them, and defines what more needs to be done (134 pp).


